



## HOTEL INFORMATION

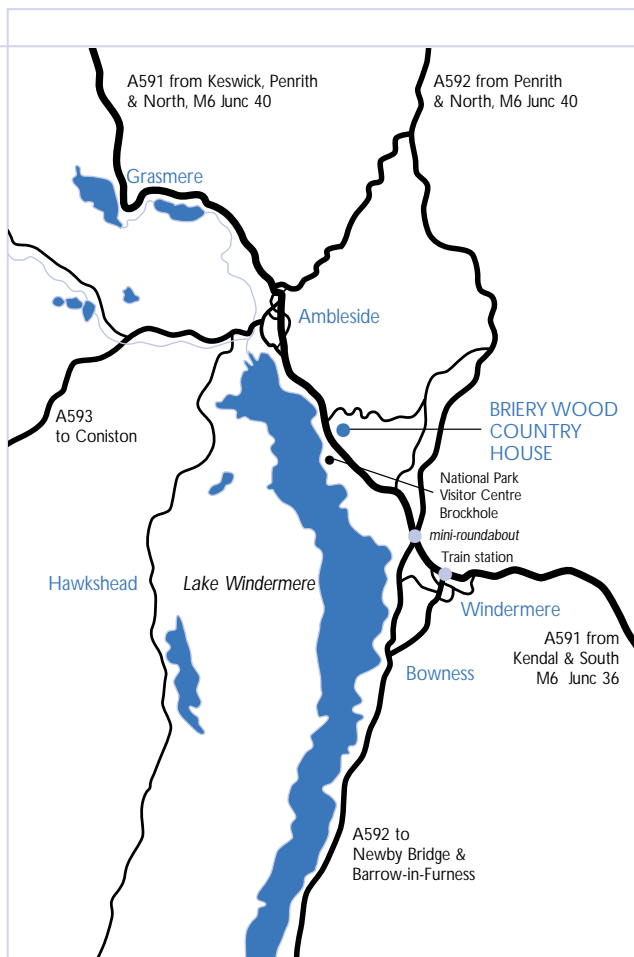
### BRIERY WOOD COUNTRY HOUSE

Briery Wood is run as a country house hotel and has a good reputation in the Lake District for the quality of its food and service. The hotel is owned by Impact and the staff are accustomed to catering for the needs of participants on programmes. During programmes there is a set lunch and dinner menu which changes daily. Our chefs can cater for any dietary requirements or preferences if they are given notice (you can provide this on the enclosed personal information form).

Rooms have en-suite facilities, TV, drink making facilities, radio alarms, hair dryers and direct dial telephones.

To travel to Briery Wood by road from the South, leave the M6 at junction 36 (Kendal, South Lakes) and follow the A591 for 15 miles, past Kendal and Windermere, until you see Briery Wood signed on the right. Briery Wood is situated half a mile past the National Park Visitor Centre at Brockhole, which is well sign-posted. It is two miles past a mini-roundabout, the only one on the A591.

From the North, leave the M6 at Junction 40, Penrith, then follow the A66 towards Keswick for approximately 12 miles. At Threlkeld turn left to take the B5322, which is signposted to Windermere. This joins the A591 Keswick/Windermere road near Thirlmere. Turn left here and travel for approximately 10 miles past Grasmere and Rydal to Ambleside. Leave Ambleside on the A591 for Windermere. Briery Wood is two miles south, on the left.

#### BY TRAIN

Travel to Oxenholme on the main Euston to Glasgow line (London 3hrs 15mins approx). Local trains from Oxenholme to Windermere approximately every hour (20mins approx). Taxis available at Windermere.

#### BY PLANE

The nearest airport is Manchester.
